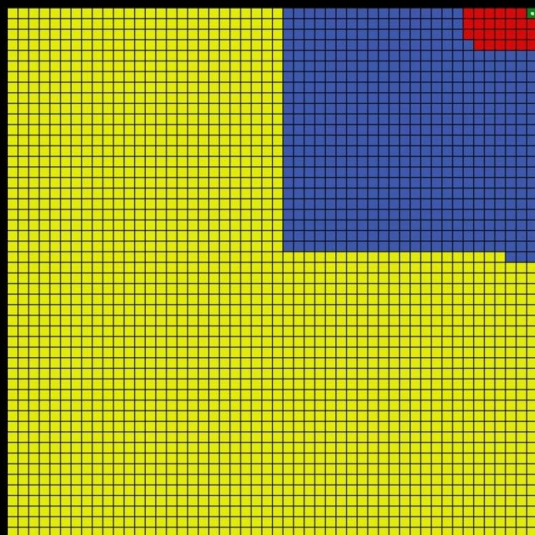

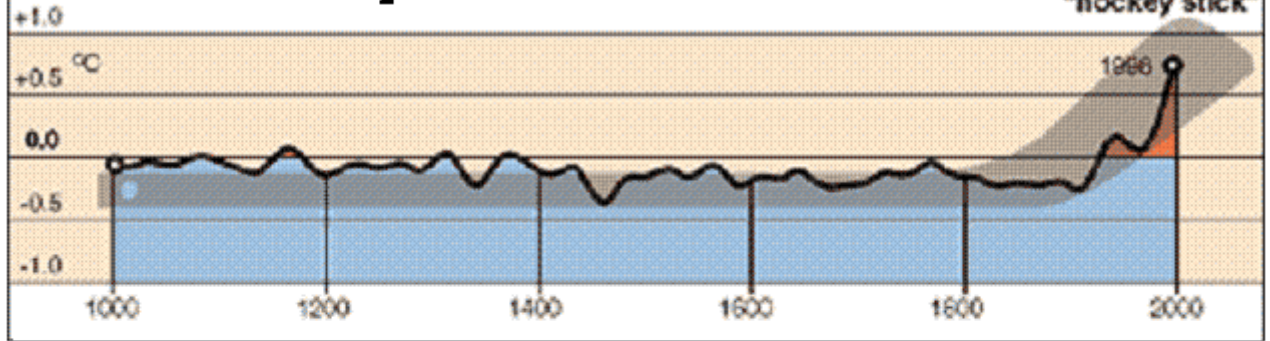

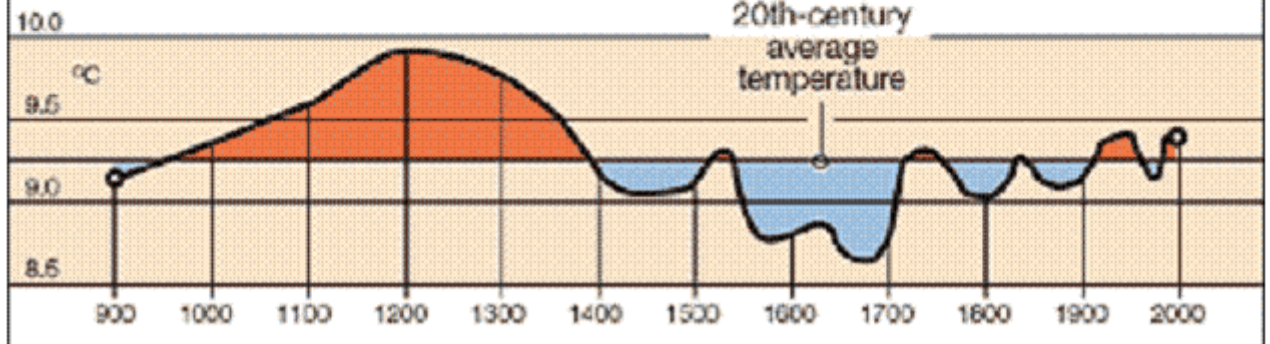

# Katastrophe auf Raten

Kommt eine neue Eiszeit? Nicht gleich, aber der verregnete Sommer in Nordeuropa, so befürchten die Klimaforscher, war nur ein Teil eines weltweiten Wetterumschwungs -- ein Vorgeschmack auf kühlere und nassere Zeiten.

11.08.1974, 13.00 Uhr • aus **DER SPIEGEL 28/1974**

desto häufiger tauchte in den Fachblättern der Meteorologen die Frage auf, ob nicht womöglich in na-her Zukunft eine neue Eiszeit heraufziehe.

\* wechselten in den letzten 700 000 Jahren große Eiszeiten fast regelmäßig mit mildereren Klimaintervallen;

\* sind auch während der jüngsten 10 000 Jahre, der Zeitspanne seit dem Ende der letzten Eiszeit, markante und oftmals abrupte Klimaänderungen aufgetreten;

Eine anhaltende Schönwetter-Ära vergleichbar der ersten Hälfte des zwanzigsten Jahrhunderts, gab es nach Ansicht der Klimaforscher etwa in den Jahren 1080 bis 1200 nach der Zeitrechnung. Damals florierte überall in England der Weinbau. Und auf Grönland ("Grünland"), wo die Wikinger Kolonien unterhielten, gedieh um das Jahr 800 eine üppige Vegetation.

Einig sind sich die Wissenschaftler immerhin über einige Faktoren, die das komplexe Klimageschehen bestimmen, wie etwa die Schwankungen der Sonnenaktivität, Unregelmäßigkeiten in der Umlaufbahn des Planeten Erde um die Sonne, Schlingerbewegungen der Erdachse, Strahlenschauer aus den Tiefen des Universums und auch Veränderungen im irdischen Magnetfeld,

Die Verringerung der Sonneneinstrahlung um nur ein Prozent oder eine Zunahme der durchschnittlichen Bewölkung des Planeten um nur vier Prozent würden genügen, um eine neue »große Eiszeit« auszulösen.

Halte die gegenwärtige Klimaverschlechterung an, so warnt etwa der US-Wissenschaftler Reid Bryson, Direktor des Instituts für Umweltstudien an der Universität von Wisconsin, so werde sie demnächst womöglich »die ganze Menschheit in Mitleidenschaft ziehen« -- »eine Milliarde Menschen würde verhungern«.

Denn mittelfristig, glauben sie, sei eine Verbesserung des Erdklimas kaum zu erhoffen.

So hält der österreichische Wissenschaftsautor Peter Kaiser ("Die Rückkehr der Gletscher") die gegenwärtigen Wetterveränderungen für Vorzeichen, die auf einen kommenden Zusammenbruch des irdischen Magnetfelds hinweisen --

Die Meteorologen hoffen außerdem, dank genauerer Kenntnisse künftig das Wetter, womöglich gar das Erdklima, planvoll beeinflussen zu können.

Gezielt wie ungewollt geschieht längst beides: Vor allem in der Sowjetunion, in den USA und in Kanada »melken« Wettermacher Regenwolken mit Silberjodid, das von Flugzeugen versprüht wird.

Aber auch die Regenmacher verlieren zuweilen die Kontrolle über das manipulierte Wetter. Noch einige Jahre, vielleicht Jahrzehnte wird es wohl dauern, bis die Wetterwissenschaftler über ein umfassendes Klima-Modell verfügen, das kalkulierte Wetter-Manipulationen ermöglichte.



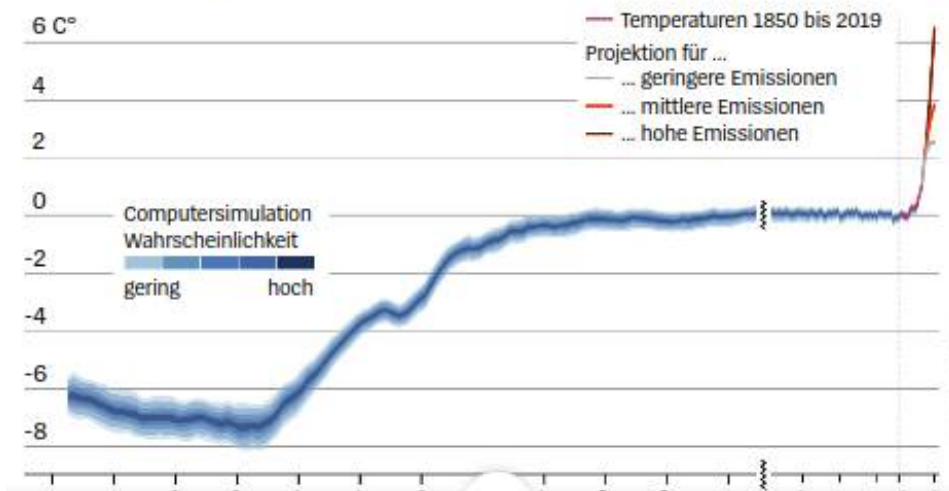

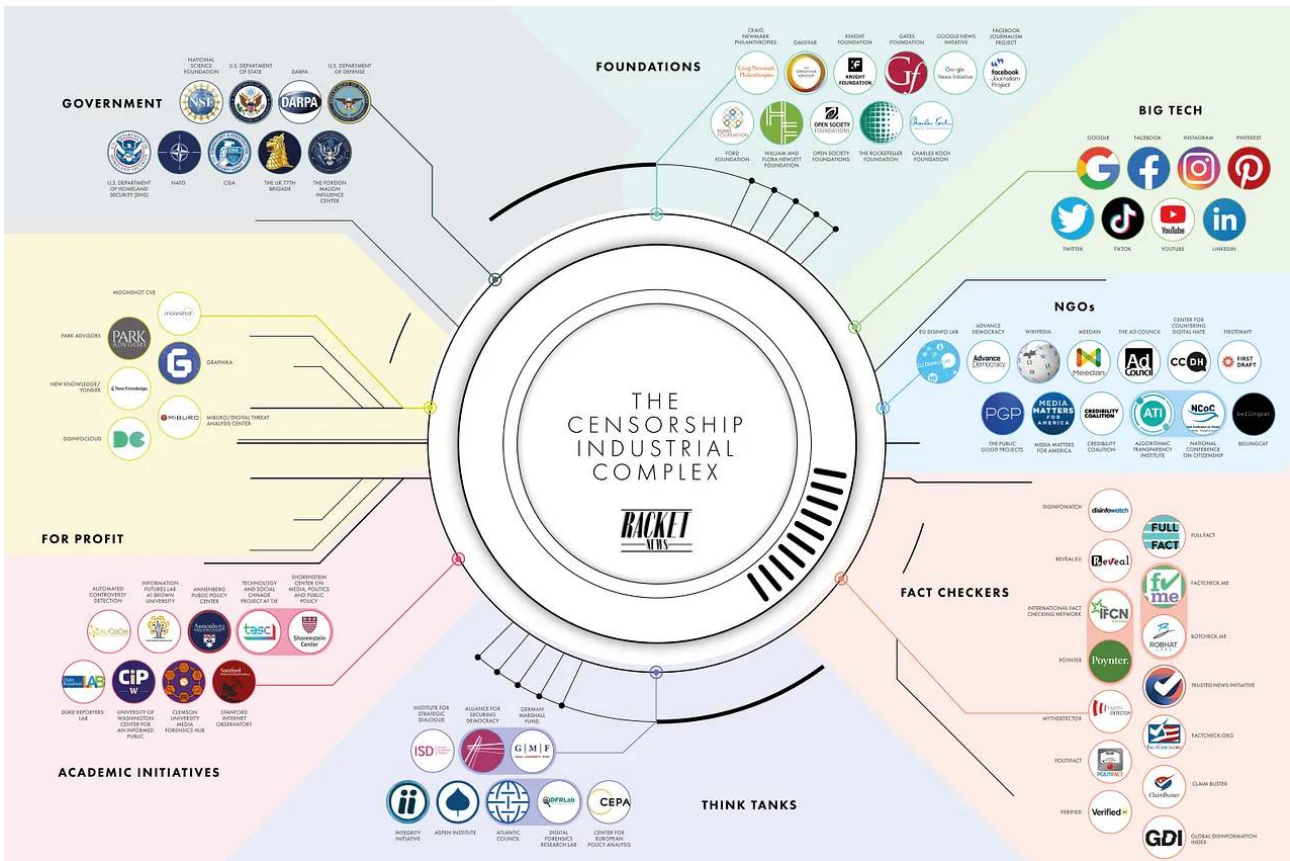
